## **Holocaust and Human Rights: New tools for Educators**

Online training sessions for educators and teachers

May 2026

These three events are part of the “CU Remember” project (<https://eucu.net/projects/curemember/>), which aims to develop innovative and transnational educational approaches to the culture of remembrance.

The sessions are designed to introduce new educational tools and pathways for students aged 8 to 18, aimed to raise awareness not only of the memory of the Holocaust and the crimes of Nazi-Fascism, but also to foster the development of a critical and democratic consciousness that is respectful of otherness and inclusive.

The webinars are intended for educators, schoolteachers, professionals working with young people, as well as interested participants. Their primary objective is to provide participants with new educational tools developed by the CU REMEMBER project, enabling them to work with children and teenagers and offer new approaches to the topic.

At the first online meeting, the Guidebook for Educators—developed following workshops held in 2025 with educators, teachers, and professionals from Austria and Italy—will be presented. The manual is intended for those who work with both children and adolescents. During the same meeting, another handbook will also be presented. This handbook is designed to help teachers and educators organize and implement two different guided tours for high school students, through science and remembrance in Trieste. These tours reconstruct the stories of people from Trieste’s scientific community whose lives were profoundly impacted by Nazi-Fascist anti-Jewish persecution.

The second appointment focuses on the University of Vienna as a site of remembrance. For younger students (aged 8–12), the emphasis lies on a guided tour of the Campus of the University of Vienna, where they encounter important individuals and selected sites of remembrance and reflect on what is remembered and why.

For older students (aged 16–18), the focus is on the persecution of Jews at the University of Vienna during National Socialism. Students explore sites of remembrance using a digital application and engage with the biographies of individuals who were expelled from the university.

The meeting will conclude with a presentation reflecting on a pilot edition of the “History Awareness Week” program. Conceived as a journey through time into Vienna’s past, the initiative introduces participants to historical thinking while exploring the diverse life stories of Viennese residents from a range of cultural backgrounds.

The session demonstrates how the topic can be addressed through different methods and perspectives across age groups and provides ideas and resources for suitable activities.

The third seminar will be held in Italian and will take place both online and in person at the “Bobi Bazlen” hall in Palazzo Gopceвич in Trieste. The Italian version of the handbook and the two guided tours mentioned in the first meeting will be presented. The decision to conduct this part in Italian is intended to reach a larger number of Italian teachers and educators who are not familiar with the English language.

A discussion session will follow at the end of each presentation.

Those who request it by filling out the appropriate form (see below) will be able to obtain a certificate of attendance issued by the University of Trieste.
